Example animal population in a healthy ecosystem



Technical Descriptions are filed without substantial examination.



Claims can be registered, too.



Anyone can issue cease & desist letters against such claims. (based on the German Abmahnung.)



In case of non-compliance, injunctions against claims can be filed.



Regular Courts decide, patent experts remain witnesses.



Examination & patent search is privatized:



When somebody finds proofs of invalidity of a patent, he is entitled to charge an examination fee from the patentee.

Public Register: File now, examine later (cf. Internet domain registry)

Privatized patent search and examination

Paid by the polluter

Incentive to file narrow claims
Incentive to get involved
Self-organizing knowledge economy

Extendable to other types of rights (trademarks, designs)

No claims, no costs (descriptions alone are treated analogous to copyright)

Free-Software-like debugging of claims
